Required Documents

- A completed application form
 - An official transcript
 - A copy of TOEFL or IELTS score (taken within two years of the application date)
 - A current resume
 - A statement of purpose essay (Maximum one page describing your background, interest in the university you chose, and your expectation of participation benefits)
 - List of your preferred universities (maximum 5 universities)
 - A copy of passport with "Certified True Copy" and your signature
 - Completed Study Plan
 - Course Equivalency Form send to both outbound.course@cbs.chula.ac.th and Outbound.exchange@cbs.chula.ac.th

Credit Transfer and Regulations

- Course registered in the partner university must be considered and approved by the Office of International Affairs to get course description equivalency.
 - The maximum number of credits that can be transferred to Chulalongkorn University in one semester is twelve (12) or 4 courses.
 - Students need to earn a grade of "C" (or equivalent) or better to get credits transferred. A cumulative GPA will not be calculated. An "S" or "Satisfactory" will be shown in the student's transcript. On the other hand, students who earned a grade lower than "C" (or equivalent), an "U" or "Unsatisfactory" will be shown in the transcript.
 - Students are responsible for rechecking the minimum grade from partner universities that can be transferred to "S" on our website as well as checking with the host university for up-to-date information. The updated version means the latest version of grading system that you will receive on the host university transcript. Misreading is unacceptable excuse.

Selection Process and Evaluation Criteria

- The Office of International Affairs will consider applicants and required documents of each student application.
- Students are free to select three (3) universities and rank them by personal preference.
- Student scores (based on GPAX and English result) will be used to determine priority in university selection.

- TOEFL or IELTS scores: 50%
